Year of India 2011 in Canada launched

On 24 January 2011, the Year of India 2011 in Canada was launched coinciding with the signing of an MoU for establishing Canada-India Centre for Excellence in Science, Technology, Trade and Policy at Carleton University. Indian Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh and Canadian Prime Minister Mr. Stephen Harper jointly announced, during PM Harper's first official visit of to India in November 2009, the celebration of the Year of India 2011 in various locations in Canada. in Ottawa. The event will include exhibition of Indian art and culture, seminars on promoting trade and business, conferences on enhanced cooperation, food and film festivals and more. The

celebrations will commence with a Sarod Recital by maestro Ustad Amjad Ali Khan at the Museum of Civilization in Gatineau on 4 March 2011. This will be followed by Shakunthalam Dance Drama at National Arts Centre on March 13; Parikrama Rock Band at Museum of Civilization on March 14; Ticket to Bollywood Musical on March 20-21; Kathakali on March 29; Fusion Dance of Tanushree Shankar on April 4. MoU signed for India Chair at Canada-India Centre of Excellence at Carleton University

A Memorandum of Understanding for establishing Canada-India Centre for Excellence in Science, Technology, Trade and Policy was signed at the Carleton University on 24 January 2011. The Indian Council for Cultural Relations is establishing a Visiting Chair focused on India-related studies in partnership with Carleton University. The MoU governing the Visiting Chair in the field of humanities and social sciences was signed by Indian High Commissioner in Ottawa Mr. S M Gavai and President of Carleton University Dr Roseann O'Reilly Runte. The Centre will be located in the Carleton University's River building which will open later this year. It will bring together key members of the academic, business and public policy communities in both countries to provide cutting edge research, analysis, training and exchanges.

Canada-India Innovation Summit

A Canada-India Innovation Summit will be held in Ottawa from May 9 to 13, 2011 in collaboration with ISTPCanada, Carleton University and the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade (DFAIT) to discuss innovation strategies in key sectors of interest to both Canada and India.

MoUs signed between Indian and Canadian universities

During the visit of Carleton President Dr. Roseann O'Reilly Runte to India from 4 to 10 February 2011 (New Delhi, Mumbai, Hyderabad), two Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) were signed – one with the University of Petroleum and Energy Studies in Delhi on renewable energy and aerospace engineering and the second with Jindal Global University on business management. Hyderabad, Dr. Runte gave a speech to faculty and students at BITS, Pilani – Hyderabad Campus. Her program in Mumbai included a meeting with journalists for a roundtable discussion.

Dr. Runte also announced that Carleton University's Canada-India centre will host two international summits later this year. The first, the Canada-India Innovation Summit, will take place from May 9 to 13 to discuss innovation strategies in key sectors of interest to both Canada and India and the second, the Canada-India Education Summit, will focus on a dialogue between vice-chancellors from India and Canadian university executives on issues surrounding leadership and strategies for higher education. The event, taking place June 17 to 18, is supported by the Shastri Institute with the support of Foreign Affairs and International Trade Canada and the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada.



ICAI signs MoU with CICA

On 7 February 2011, the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants signed a Memorandum of Understanding on Reciprocal Membership Arrangements which removes a number of significant barriers for Indian Chartered Accountants with respect to obtaining the Canadian Chartered Accountancy designation. This was the outcome of serious negotiations of last four years between the two Institutes. The MOU recognizes the similarity of accounting education for CAs in both countries and will reduce the admission requirements for qualified CAs from India. Under the MOU:

- **An ICAI** member who holds a recognized university degree will be eligible to become a Canadian CA by passing the Canadian Uniform Evaluation (UFE) and meeting the profession's experience requirements.
- **Individuals with a Canadian CA designation** will be eligible to become an ICAI member by passing the ICAI's examinations in corporate and allied laws and tax.

MoU signed between CSI and RCPSC

On 11 January 2011, the College of Surgeons of India (CSI) and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) signed a Memorandum of Understanding in Ottawa to build a strong relationship to establish the CSI for the development and evolution of an educational partnership between the RCPSC and CSI with a view to advancement of surgical residency education in India. The MoU was signed by Dr. Narendra Kumar Pandey, President, CSI and Dr. Andrew Padmos, Chief Executive Officer, RCPSC. The MoU is perpetual in nature unless either party provides the other with a not less than 12 months written notice to terminate it. The MoU is intended to enable a strong education partnership between the parties whereas the RCPSC will support the CSI in its efforts to raise the standards and operational performance of surgical training programs in India.

Canadian exports of spruce lumber to India

On 17 January, Minister of International Trade Peter Van Loan announced the opening of Canadian exports of spruce lumber to India. The announcement comes as a result of India's recent certification of Canada's spruce lumber for import. Minister Van Loan stated that "continued collaboration between Canada and India in expanding access for other types of wood could lead to rapid growth in overall Canadian wood exports to India."

Bilateral trade goes up

India-Canada bilateral trade figures indicated an upward trend during the period January-November 2010 as compared to same period in 2009. India's exports to Canada registered 14.5 per cent increase whereas India's imports from Canada were up by 6.0 per cent over the same period in 2009. Overall bilateral trade during January-November 2010 showed 10 per cent increase over the same period in 2009.



Exports touch 33-month high level in December

India's merchandise exports rose to \$ 22.5 billion in December 2010, up 36.4 per cent on an annual basis – the highest in 33 months. India is expected to not only meet the \$ 200 billion target for 2010-11 but may exceed it as well. Imports, however, grew at a slower pace, rising 11.1 per cent to \$ 25.13 billion over the same period last year resulting in narrowing of trade deficit by \$ 2.6 billion. With Indian exporters having robust order books, the exports are expected to rise in the next financial year too.

On the other hand, India's engineering exports rose to US\$ 5.5 billion in December 2010, growing by about 50 per cent on a year-on-year basis. These include heavy engineering goods, transport equipment, capital goods, other machinery/equipment and light engineering products, etc.

16.5 per cent growth in pharma sector

In 2010, the Indian domestic pharma sector registered a 16.5 per cent growth reflecting the inherent strengths of the industry and improving healthcare standards in the country. This was also the second successive year of strong growth for the industry. Almost all the Indian companies in the pharma sector recorded a growth of over 10 per cent for the year.

Bar coding made mandatory for pharma exports

From July 1, 2011, the bar coding on all medicine packs meant for exports has been made mandatory by the Commerce Ministry to trace and track the medicines to its source of origin. In a public notice issued on January 10, 2011, the Directorate General of Foreign Trade specified that the rule mandates all exporters of pharmaceutical products to be equipped with the technology to affix bar codes during the interim period. Furthermore, the track and trace technology that should be used by drug exporters should conform to the GS-1 standards at all levels of packaging. GS-1 is a global organization that designs and implement such standards.

India to become 4th largest passenger vehicle market in three years

According to global consulting firm Booz & Co., India is poised to become the world's fourth largest passenger vehicles market in three years. It is expected to touch \$ 3.5 million units mark. Currently, the market enjoys the seventh position in the world. India will need 6 to 9 new car plants with an average annual capacity of 1.5 lakh units. This will require an investment of at least US\$ 15-20 billion.

Capacity addition sets new record during 2010-11

On 21 January, Union Power Minister Mr. Sushilkumar Shinde announced that India set a new record by crossing 10,000 MW of capacity addition in a single financial since Independence. In earlier five year plans, the country has not crossed beyond 5,500 MW in a financial year. By the end of 2010-11, total capacity addition of 15,000 MW would be possible, stated the Minister. The increase in capacity addition was possible mainly due to continuous monitoring, placement of orders in time and better coordination with various departments for speedy clearances.



India's MRO industry to be worth \$ 1.5 billion by 2020

India is poised to become the fastest growing market in the world for aircraft maintenance, repair and overhaul (MRO) services over the next decade tripling its worth to \$1.5 billion, as airline companies buy more planes to cater for the country's rapidly growing traffic. At present, the MRO expenditure by airlines in India is \$ 500 million which is expected to grow to \$ 1.5 billion by 2020. On the other hand, the air traffic will triple to 362 million passengers by 2021-22

` 20.83 lakh crore (US\$ 450 billion) MoUs at Vibrant Gujarat

In all, 7,936 memorandums of understanding (MoUs) worth ` 20.83 lakh crore (US\$ 450 billion) were signed during the two-day Vibrant Gujarat Global Investors Summit 2011 held in Ahmedabad in January 2011. The investments pledged by national and international corporate giants this year far exceeded the commitments made in the summit last year. As many as 1400 delegates from 101 nations including Canada participated in the Summit this year.

India-based Tata Communications, a global communications service provider, has signed a sourcing agreement with Videotron, an integrated communications company based in Quebec. Under this agreement, Videotron will route 100% of its international voice traffic through the Tata Communications network and Videotron will continue to be one of Tata Communications' key suppliers of telecommunication services in Canada.

On 20 January, Montreal-based CAE Inc. announced that it has been awarded a series of military contracts to supply several foreign defense forces, including those of some Asian countries (India, South Korea, Japan). The company will provide Advanced Integrated Magnetic Anomaly Detection (MAD) System for eight P-8I Poseidon aircraft to be operated by the Indian Navy. CAE is a provider of simulation and modeling technologies and integrated training solutions for the civil aviation industry and defense forces. The total value of the new contracts is more than C\$140 million.

CAE, a Montreal-based company that provides simulation and modeling technologies and integrated training solutions for the civil aviation industry and defence forces, announced on 12 January that it has sold one of its A320 full-flight simulators (FFS) to an undisclosed customer in India.

(MHI), has completed the execution of the 200 bus queue shelters contract valued at CDN \$1.60 million, awarded by one of India's Out of Home Media companies. The contract was awarded on August 20, 2010. Minaean International Corp. is an innovator of efficient building systems using cold formed steel technologies.

On 1st February, the Board of Trade of Metropolitan Montreal announced the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding with the Indian Merchants' Chamber at the beginning of the 2011 trade mission to India. The trade mission was organized by the Government of Quebec in cooperation with the Board of Trade's team of international trade experts, the World Trade Centre Montréal and Canada's Medical Technology Companies. The Indian Merchants' Chamber, based in Mumbai, has 3,200 direct members and 225 affiliated member associations, comprising more than 250,000 companies across the country.

From India

A four-member delegation led by Mrs. Rashmi Goel, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs visited Canada (Ottawa) during 30 January to 02 February 2011 for negotiations on issues/matters relating to extradition and legal assistance in criminal matters. From Alberta Government side, Mr. Paul Whittaker, Deputy Minister of International and Inter-governmental Relations attended the Roadshow.

A 3-member delegation led by Mr. Prashant Shukle, Director General, Mapping Information Branch, Natural Resources Canada visited India to participate in the Geospatial World Forum in Hyderabad – January 18-21, 2011. Mr. Shukle received a national mapping award on behalf of the Mapping Information Branch during the Forum. The delegation also included representatives from a number of Canadian companies in the field of spatial data infrastructure and remote sensing and disaster management.
